### NADINE BURKE HARRIS, MD, MPH, FAAP

*Founder and Chief Executive Officer, Center for Youth Wellness*

Dr. Nadine Burke Harris is a pediatrician and leader in the movement to transform our response to early childhood adversity and the resulting toxic stress dramatically impacting health and longevity. By exploring the science behind childhood adversity, she offers a new way to understand the adverse events that affect all of us throughout our lifetimes. Bringing these new approaches to audiences at the Mayo Clinic, American Academy of Pediatrics, Google Zeitgeist and Dreamforce, Nadine's TED Talk, "How childhood trauma affects health across a lifetime," has been viewed more than 3 million times. Most recently, her work was profiled in Jamie Redford's film, *RESILIENCE*. Nadine's book, *The Deepest Well*, on the issue of Childhood Adversity and Health was released in January 2018.



### JAMES REDFORD

*Documentary Filmmaker and Co-Founder and Chair, The Redford Center*

James Redford is a screenwriter, director and producer. The Redford Center is a non-profit media entity that engages people through inspiring stories that galvanize environmental action. His documentary *RESILIENCE: The Biology of Stress and the Science of Hope* forms a companion piece to his documentary entitled *Paper Tigers*. Both films are productions of KPJR Films. *RESILIENCE* is an engrossing study of how Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) can be linked to destructive behavior and medical diseases. In his own words "We created *RESILIENCE* to make this science digestible and relevant to everyone, and to showcase some of the inspiring individuals who are putting that science into action." There is a growing group of pediatricians, educators and communities who are proving that cycles of disease and adversity can be broken.
